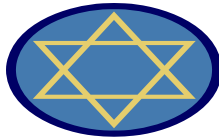

## Remembering Debbie Friedman z"l (1951-2011)

Like so many American Jews, I was deeply saddened by the passing of Debbie Friedman z"l on January 9th. Admittedly, I did not grow up or identify with Debbie's music, though my older sister was an acquaintance of Debbie's through songleader circles. Nonetheless, I was constantly aware of her music's impact among many of my Reform Jewish friends. So why, I thought to myself, was I so impacted by her passing?

I had the opportunity to meet Debbie Friedman just three years ago, when she served as the "keynote singer" at the (Conservative) Cantors' Assembly (CA) convention in 2008. I had just been ordained as a Cantor two weeks before, and I was awed by the spectrum of cantorial talent at this annual gathering of Chazzanim from across North America. Yet, it was Debbie Friedman, who for years was shunned by the CA and more traditional Judaism, who brought down the house with her simple, emotive words and a sing-along version of her newest composition, set to *Oseh Shalom*.

After her rousing speech and performance, I spotted Debbie browsing among the Judaica vendors in the hotel lobby. I wanted to approach her and tell her that I was moved by her speech and had been a longtime fan of her work, yet this greeting felt disingenuous. I sought to inform Debbie of her connection to my sister, but I didn't want to pander for self-gratification via name recognition. Or what if she did not remember my sister by name? Ultimately, I let her walk by without uttering a word.

As I culled through the myriad synagogue tributes in Debbie's memory, I considered the gradual permeation of Debbie's catalogue into my Jewish music vernacular. I immediately recalled the various *Havdalot* I have led chanting her "la-la-la, la-la-la-la...". While in cantorial school I learned the more traditional ways to chant the Havdallah blessings, but no opportunity afforded itself to use traditional modes, rather than Debbie's more approachable melody. Secondly, I realized the spiritual power held by her "*Mi She-Beirach*" healing prayer. I in fact, I have employed this melody twice at Temple Ner Tamid: Once at the 5770 Yom Kippur healing service in the chapel, and just recently on the first Shabbat after her passing.

Then I dug deeper into the Friedman library. Her "*L'chi Lach*" altered the way I imagine Abraham's journey from Ur in *Parashat Lech L'cha*. Debbie's "*Im Tirtzu*" represents my direct link to the truly prophetic words of Theodor Herzl. And various 'hits' including "Not By Might", "Miriam's Song", "*Ani Ma'amin*", "*V'ahavta*" and Debbie's original "*Oseh Shalom*" have intersected my life at various points as a (non-denominational) Jewish Day School student, religious school teacher, USY advisor, convention *madrich* and Young Adult lay leader. And for three decades of Jewish religious school students, their entry to the Hebrew Alphabet was accompanied by Debbie's "*Aleph-Bet-Vet, Gimel Dalet Hay...*" I narrowly missed the cut on that demographic.

After exhausting my personal identification with "Songs of the Spirit: The Debbie Friedman Anthology" on iTunes, I considered her Hebrew name *D'vorah*, which comes from the Hebrew root *dalet, bet, reish*--meaning "to speak". Debbie certainly spoke for a generation of Jews who needed a modern way to express their connection to the liturgy. The *dalet, bet, reish* root also creates words like "*BaMidbar*", the fourth book of the Bible, which translates as "in the wilderness". Much like Moses did 3,500 years earlier, Debbie led many Jews through the spiritual wilderness to find their own voice.

Finally, a lesser-known cognate of the *dalet, bet, reish* root is "*d'vir*" (the Holy of Holies), which can be found in the *R'tzei* blessing of the *Amidah*. The Holy of Holies refers to the room in the *Beit HaMikdash* (Great Temple) where the High Priest would enter once a year--on Yom Kippur--and recite the Tetragrammaton, the four-letter-word for G-d. For hundreds of thousands of American Jews, *Devorah* Friedman gave unprecedented access to a lofty level of holiness through her music. Perhaps some may consider her a High Priestess of Jewish music!

On Friday, March 4th, Cheryl Miller, Rich Sokolow and myself will present "Shabbat Around the World", a musical service filled with melodies from countries including Italy, South Africa, Argentina, Israel and of course the USA. Whether we sing her "*Ahavat Olam*", "*Mi Chamocha*" or "*V'Sham'ru*", I could not designate a more fitting ambassador for American Jewish liturgical music than Debbie Friedman. May her memory be a blessing...and an enduring legacy. *Zichronah livrachah*.

Rabbinic Judaism teaches us that in our calendar we have four new years. The first of Nisan is the new year "for kings and festivals," and it is considered the first month in the Jewish year. The first of Elul is the new year for the tithing of animals. This is the ancient practice of offering a portion of one's livestock in thanks to God. The first of Tishrei (Rosh Hashanah) is the new year for calendar years, jubilee years, sabbatical years, planting, and vegetables; and the 15<sup>th</sup> --- or Tu (for the Hebrew letters tet-vav, whose combined numerical value is 15) B'Shevat is the near year for trees, marking the time from which we count a tree's age, and the date by which to define the end of the year for fruit crops.

Over the years these new years have taken on different or additional significance for us. Nisan is the month in which Passover falls. Elul is the month of introspection and anticipation that leads up to the High Holy Days. Rosh Hashanah, while falling on the first day of the seventh month, is still the mark of the new numerical calendar year. And Tu B'shevat is the festival in which we mark the beginning of spring in Israel as this is the date that marks the time when the sap starts flowing in the trees in Eretz Yisrael.

Many of us grew up with Jewish National Fund blue boxes and planting trees in Israel, either physically on trips to the holy land or by purchasing trees for which we received special certificates from JNF. In more recent decades, the practice of the Tu B'shevat seder was added to the traditions of many synagogues and religious schools. The custom of the Tu B'shevat seder began with the Kabbalists in Safed in the sixteenth century. The custom of eating fifteen different kinds of fruit -- especially those found in Eretz Yisrael --- on the holiday became organized into a seder that also included four cups of wine (or juice) much like the Passover seder.

On Sunday, January 23, our religious school students, teachers and many parents celebrated Tu B'shevat with a seder in our social hall. We began by singing and talking about what blessings trees offer us and what we can, in return offer them. We then truly reminded ourselves of how alive a tree really is by creating a tree "orchestra" --- each class representing a part of the tree with a motion and a sound, until our social hall brimmed with the tapestry of sound that illustrated the tree as a vibrant, living organism. We drank four cups of juice --- the first, all "white" (apple) to remind us of winter; the second, white with a little red, to remind us of the emergence of spring; the third, red with a little white, to bring us toward summer; and the fourth, all red, to remind us of the richness

and fullness of the harvest time. We tasted fifteen kinds of foods: fruits with an inedible exterior: clementines, pomegranate, kiwi; fruits with an inedible pit: olives, dates, apricots and peaches; then fruits that can be eaten in their entirety, and also foods made with wheat: carob (bokser - the real thing) and carob chips, fig newtons, grapes, raisins, vanilla wafers, strawberries; and, finally, apples dipped in maple syrup! We sang and we celebrated the beginning of spring in Israel, something that is hard to imagine for us as we are surrounded by piles of snow and frigid temperatures.

Just as we read the story of the seventy-year-old man who planted a carob tree not for himself but for the future generations, we also planted for the future. To conclude our seder, we planted parsley seeds to start plants that will hopefully produce parsley for our Passover seder tables. Each student took home his or her own newly planted seeds, and additional plants are being started in our classrooms. Students and families will also have an opportunity to purchase trees in Israel, and each will take home the newest version of the JNF blue box to encourage the practice of collecting and giving tzedakah money.

Through our religious school programs and lessons, we continue to plant for the future. Chazak, chazak, v'nit-chazeik! May we go from strength to strength!

Back to the classics! Our next selection is S.Y. Agnon, *Only Yesterday* (Princeton University Press, 2000, available used for about \$18).
