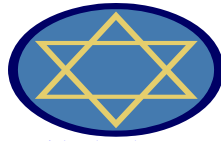

SHABBAT UNPLUGGED

March 5 is billed as a "National Day of Unplugging." There is a project called "The Sabbath Manifesto." You can look it up online at <http://www.sabbathmanifesto.org/>

There was a Wall Street Journal article about it in January with the title, "Your BlackBerry or Your Wife: When the Whole Family Is Staring at Screens, Time to Try a Tech Detox."

You can even get a "sleeping bag" for your cellphone! This Day of Unplugging is for those of us--I include myself--who sleep with our phones near us, check email or Facebook or Twitter all the time. Days go by, and we hardly ever speak to our loved ones. We're addicted, we need rehab.

The WSJ article says: "Like an extreme diet that cuts out all processed foods for a short period of time with the promise of lasting good health, a technology cleanse means you unplug for a short time with longer-term benefits for your relationships."

Well, on Shabbat I don't use the phone, or watch TV or listen to the radio. Like going on a diet, it's not an easy thing to do. It takes a lot of willpower to pull back. It reminds me of the old joke about how many psychiatrists it takes to change a light bulb--only one, but the light bulb has to want to change.

Perhaps you need to completely burnout before you'll consider unplugging once in a while. If you're not used to unplugging, you will have to force yourself to go cold turkey on the cellphone and computer for a few hours, or a day. But there are rewards, great rewards. I find that a Shabbat break makes a real difference in how I interact with others and the world. And I'm more aware of how banal, how consumptive, my time is, how carelessly I spend much of my energy during the week.

For your own sake, and the good of your family, please consider observing this National Day of Unplugging. Put your phone to sleep for awhile. Perhaps you can even make it a weekly event.

Putting the Fun in Synagogue Life

The Hebrew word for "fun" is *keif*, from the verb *l'chayeif*, to have fun. Over the past two years at Temple Ner Tamid, I have never read this word in any siddur, *machzor*, Torah portion, Haftarah or Megillat Esther. Upon further exploration, I discovered that *keif* is a modern Hebrew adaptation of the Arabic word for "pleasure".

Perhaps this finding begs the question: Is there room for "fun" in synagogue ritual life? One quick look at the Book of Psalms convinced me that there is certainly ample opportunity for joy in daily Jewish life. And shouldn't fun be a necessary byproduct of joy?

~~ "You put joy into my heart when their grain and wine show increase." Psalms 4:8

~~ "You will teach me the path of life. In Your presence is perfect joy; delights are ever in Your right hand." Psalms 16:11

In the Hallel service we sing:

~~ "Zeh hayom asa Adonai, nagila v'nism'cha vo."--"This is the day Adonai has made--let us exult and rejoice in it" Psalm 118:24

...and this passage appears in Psalm 27, which we chant as we approach the High Holidays:

~~ "Now is my head high over my enemies roundabout; I sacrifice in G-d's tent with shouts of joy; singing and chanting a hymn to the Lord"

Psalms 27:6

A peek at the Jewish calendar offers an even better excuse to have fun. According to the Talmud, the month of Adar, in which Purim falls, is supposed to be the happiest month of the year: "*Mishenichnas Adar, marbin b'simcha!*"--"Whoever enters the month of Adar, joy increases. Taanit 29a. And when a leap year occurs (7 out of every 19 years, including this year), we get two Adars. "Double the pleasure, double the fun" in Adar derives more meaning than just a snappy chewing gum slogan.

For my final authoritative comment, I look no further than chabad.org. In their "Can Judaism be fun" article by Tzvi Freeman, he writes, "Some say G-d created the world so we could party. It's only half true. G-d created it so G-d could party with us." That's good enough for me!

Please allow me the opportunity to invite you to two FUN ritual events. First, on March 4th (as we begin the 29th of Adar I), Cheryl Miller, Rich Sokolow and I will present "Shabbat around the World": a special musical service featuring melodies from Argentina, South Africa, Italy, Canada, Israel and the United States (as represented by Craig Taubman, Richard Silverman and Debbie Friedman z"l). The white shirts are planning a fabulous internationally-flavored meal beforehand, so the night is a can't miss. Rumor has it that some dancing might 'spontaneously' erupt from the final *Yigdal* melody!

Second, while Temple Ner Tamid's Saturday night Purim celebration will be a one-of-a-kind affair, I want to invite parents to join their children (it is a religious school day) on Sunday morning, March 20th (14th of Adar II), when we read *Megillat Esther* in its entirety. I have been collaborating with Laura Berkson to infuse some interactive "commercial interruptions" to the Megillah reading, and students will be invited to sing a few holiday songs they have prepared. Plus, you can witness Cantor Steve transform (a la Superman) from his tallit and tefillin into a one-of-a-kind Purim costume.

Based on the busy schedule of Israeli dancing, movie nights, Texas Hold-Em, card parties and special auctions, even an outside observer would surmise that Temple Ner Tamid knows how to have fun all year long. Now you have the excuse to increase the "*keif*" for two months, and an invitation to two ritual events that can fulfill that goal.

Sisterhood Salutations

In biblical days, our ancestors realized that some years would need twelve months and others, thirteen. Perhaps you have noticed that as we enter the month of March, we are still in Adar I; but, soon we will be in Adar II because this is a leap year. Why has this month been chosen as the one to have twice?

This month of Adar has a slogan: "Be happy, it's Adar." The reason for our joy is the holiday of Purim. What better month to double than a month that is designated for happiness? Actually, there is another reason that this month is doubled. Adar comes right before Nissan, the month when Passover is celebrated. The most important reason for the leap year is so that Passover will always be celebrated in the Spring.

We are all familiar with the story of Purim and the main characters: King Ahashuerus, Mordechai, Queen Vashti, Queen Esther and Haman. But are you aware of some of the foods related to Purim? I was not until recently and would like to share some of these food stories with you.

There is a special Purim challah, known as "keylitsh". The challah is oversized and extensively braided. The braids on the challah are intended to remind people of the rope used to hang Haman.

Bean dishes are eaten on Purim. They include salted beans and chickpeas seasoned with salt and pepper. This is to remind us that Esther would not eat anything at the court of King Ahashuerus that was not kosher, so she followed a vegetarian diet mainly of peas and beans.

Among Sephardic Jews, it is a custom to wrap pastry dough around a decorated hard-boiled egg to create the shape of a Purim character.

The most well known Purim treat is the triangular filled pastry called "hamantashen", a Yiddish term meaning "Haman's pockets". The tradition of the shape is to remind us of the hats worn by the officers of the Persian court, including Haman.

So, as we enter the month of Adar II, let's follow the tradition of "being happy" by performing a mitzvah, attending a fund raiser or just socializing. Watch your mail for our upcoming happy events – Passover workshop, Donor Dinner and Torah Fund Dinner.

Let me end with an anonymous quote "In the months and years ahead, may we all gain enhanced awareness of the cycles of the moon and the sun and be inspired by G-d's celestial creations. Let us increasingly integrate the natural phenomena of new moon and changing seasons into the fabric of our daily lives. Let us look to the heavens for inspiration and pray for peace on earth. Then, more and more, may we live our lives by our sacred Jewish calendar."
